Thanking and Asking Prayers

Confession – (repeated after the leader)

Priest or Deacon: Please repeat after me...

Loving God sometimes we make mistakes

We forget to love you and ourselves

We say and do things that hurt others

Please forgive us and help us to do better Amen.

Absolution

Priest: *God Loves you and forgives you.*

The Peace: *Share a sign of love with the people you are with.*

The Great Thanksgiving

Priest: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Priest: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them to the Lord.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Priest: It is a right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, God Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. Therefore, we sing your praises with angels, saints and Christians of very time and place:

Priest -- On the night before he died, Jesus gathered his friends together at a table to share a meal. He lifted up the bread to God and gave thanks. Then Jesus broke the bread and gave it to his friends saying, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said, "Drink of this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith, saying:

All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Priest: We thank you for your presence, and ask that your Holy Spirit be in this bread, this wine and in us. Fill them and us with the Spirit of Jesus. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and forever.

The Lord's Prayer

Our Father who art in Heaven

Hallowed be thy name.

Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done

One earth as it is in Heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread,

And forgive us our trespasses

As we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation

But deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom, and the power and glory

For ever and ever. Amen!

The Breaking of the Bread

Priest: Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

All: Therefore, let us keep the feast. Alleluia!

Priest: The Body of Christ the Bread of Heaven

While the people at in-person worship are receiving communion you can sing along with the music or share ways that you can be Christ for others this week.

Prayer After Communion

Priest: Let us pray.

(Priest says line first, all repeat)

We thank you, Lord, for this life.

We thank you for this holy food.

Strengthen us to be your hands and feet in this world.

And thank you for being with us always. Amen.

The Blessing

God's blessing be with you,

Christ's peace be with you,

the Spirit's outpouring be with you,

now and always. Amen.

Deacon: Go in peace to love and serve the Lord. Alleluia, Alleluia!

All: Thanks be to God! Alleluia, Alleluia!

Recessional

Move to the speed of the song and sing along.

Go now in peace.

May the love of God surround you.
